FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE: CMP Agrees to Hike Rates, Pine Tree Power a Path to Savings

May 31, 2023 - Today, Central Maine Power (CMP) <u>reached an agreement</u> in their rate case. While we are still have to wait to see if the agreement will be approved by state regulators, it is already clear that it is a bad deal for Mainers.

Mainers cannot afford any additional rate increases while supply costs continue to go through the roof. Just this month, we learned that CMP sent out over <u>60,000 disconnection notices</u> to customers who couldn't keep up with the skyrocketing prices... that's almost 10% of their customers! CMP does not need any more of our hard-earned dollars. In 2022 alone, they took in a \$156 million profit. Because their profits are legally guaranteed, CMP has been able to keep raising rates despite having the <u>worst customer satisfaction rating</u> in the nation and causing Maine to have the most <u>frequent outages</u> in the nation.

Pine Tree Power Campaign Manager, Al Cleveland said, "Even while providing worst-in-the-nation service, we continue to see CMP's greed is unmatched. The Pine Tree Power Company will bring Mainers the opportunity to save \$367 per year! Our bills are already too high; we need rate savings and that's what Pine Tree Power can bring."

Mainers will have the opportunity to vote on the Pine Tree Power initiative on November 7.
